



# Northern Ireland Assembly News – March 2022

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## **Speaker's Business**

<u>End of Mandate</u> – As 22<sup>nd</sup> March was the last normal sitting day of the mandate, the Speaker took the opportunity along with others to make some brief remarks to mark the end of the Assembly mandate.

## **Executive Committee Business**

Climate Change (No. 2) Bill: Further Consideration Stage (1st March)

<u>Climate Change (No. 2) Bill: Final Stage (9<sup>th</sup> March)</u> - The Climate Change (No. 2) Bill passed its final stage. Key components of the Bill will include: A net zero target for GHG emissions, preferably by 2045 or earlier but no later than 2050; A requirement for Climate Action Plans and carbon budgets for all sectors; A mechanism for independent NI based scrutiny through a Climate office and Climate Commissioner; and Provision for a just transition to help support sectors move to net zero.

<u>Draft Greenhouse Gas Emissions Trading Scheme (Amendment) Order 2022</u> – Members debated and approved the Order which will make various technical operational amendments to the UK Emissions Trading Scheme. They will not impact on N's electricity generating installations, which continue to participate in the EU scheme under the terms of the Northern Ireland protocol.

Energy Performance of Buildings (Certificates & Inspections) (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2022 – Members approved the draft regulations which reduce the statutory fees that are charged when data is registered on the energy performance of buildings register, particularly in relation to energy performance certificates (EPCs), display energy certificates and air conditioning inspection reports for properties.

### **Ministerial Statements**

<u>Future Agricultural Policy Decisions for Northern Ireland</u> – The AERA Minister took opportunity to make a statement to the Assembly on his decisions regarding future agricultural policy for Northern Ireland.

<u>Bovine Tuberculosis in Northern Ireland</u> – The AERA Minister delivered a statement on his decisions on the way forward for a new strategy to eradicate bovine tuberculosis from NI including his intention to introduce a programme of badger intervention in areas of high TB incidence, initially through a cull of badgers.

Environment Strategy – The AERA Minister made a statement on Northern Ireland's first overarching environment strategy. The strategy sets out six strategic environmental outcomes that encompass the main environmental, these outcomes are: excellent air, water, land and neighbourhood quality; a healthy and accessible environment and landscapes that everyone can connect with and enjoy; thriving, resilient and connected nature and wildlife; sustainable production and consumption on land and at sea; zero waste and a highly developed circular economy; and net zero greenhouse gas emissions and improved climate resilience and adaptability.

#### **Committee Business**

<u>Budget 2022-25: Committee for Finance and Northern Ireland Fiscal Council Reports</u> - Speaking on behalf of the AERA Committee during the debate, the Committee Chair stated that several major resource pressures are anticipated including an approximate deficit of £6 million per annum against the environment fund and strategic environment fund that will inevitably delay the progress of initiatives such as the environment and peatland strategies and climate change plans.
